INTRODUCTION: Train to Go - Expanding the Kingdom of Jesus (Matthew 28:16-20)

Question: What actually happens to me when my <u>faith grows strong and mature</u>?

- Are there signs I am getting stronger and more mature? How would I know?
- When athletes mature, you see it: A runner runs farther and faster; a lifter gets muscles; a baseball pitcher has more control
- When your faith grows, you see it in your heart and soul

Story:

- When I was a little guy, I had to clean my room. My poor mother had to go through so many techniques to get me motivated to do it -- showed me how, removed privileges like no cartoons until it was done, used my allowance as leverage
- As I grew up, something happened: Today, I can't stand a cluttered bedroom

In the same way, when I learned of the Great Commission, it was frightening.

- First, I avoided it. Next, "it's my duty." Then "I should." Then "out of thanksgiving . . . " Finally I saw the benefit but it still felt like a duty.
- Now, as Paul says, "Woe is me if do not preach the gospel" (1 Cor. 9:16)

I <u>am</u> the Great Commission. Your goal should be to **become** the Great Commission. This is how you know you are maturing in the faith.

1st step in becoming the Great Commission is to care about what Jesus cares about.

- Luke15:1-7 Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near Jesus to listen to Him. 2 And both the Pharisees and the scribes began to complain, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them." 3 And so He told them this parable, saying, 4 "What man among you, if he has a hundred sheep and has lost one of them, does not leave the other ninetynine in the open pasture and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it? 5 And when he has found it, he puts it on his shoulders, rejoicing. 6 And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, because I have found my sheep that was lost!' 7 I tell you that in the same way, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance.
- What Jesus does is change the frame of reference of lost people
 - They matter to God
 - How do you know you are growing in maturity in your faith: When you start caring about the salvation of lost people
 - A desire to see the Kingdom of God expand is the heart's desire of mature disciples
- I can't write people off, but I also can't compromise the Gospel. So this is where growth really takes place. The dilemma forces you to reconcile the Gospel truth with the needs of the lost

2nd step in becoming the Great Commission is celebrate what Jesus celebrates.

- The parable in verse 7 says, "I tell you that in the same way, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance."
- In verse 32, Jesus quotes the father of the prodigal son. "But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has begun to live, and was lost and has been found."
- Jesus is thinking about joy -- Heaven is rejoicing!
- Mature people seek joy even in the midst of dire circumstances, troubling times, challenging obstacles
 - Story: Woman dying of cancer leading others to Jesus. How can a person be joyful over such a terrible thing?
- It's easy to be bitter, angry, mad when things aren't going well. This is why having a joyful spirit in the midst of difficulties is a sign of maturity and strength.

Let's spend 2024 expanding the kingdom of God by growing our own faith -- the two are interconnected.

Be a BRINGER

- Our messages on Sunday morning are going to focus on what the Bible teaches on subjects that most people are dealing with every single day
