The Message: INSPIRED (#2)

Today's Passage - John 19:25-27 (NIV)

Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. 26 When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to her, "Woman, here is your son," 27 and to the disciple, "Here is your mother." From that time on, this disciple took her into his home.

Those mentioned at the crucifixion

- Mary, Jesus' mother
- Salome
- Jesus' mother's sister (many scholars have no problem with this being Salome)
 - Interesting twist would make John, the disciple, Jesus' cousin
- Mary Magdalene
- Mary the wife of Clopas
- The disciple Jesus loved

Who is the disciple Jesus loved?

- It is widely accepted this is John the disciple and author of this Gospel
- He doesn't name himself

Why did Jesus choose John to care for His mother?

- Jesus wasn't worried about His mother's financial well-being... He had her spiritual well-being at the top of His mind
 - James, Jesus' brother, would have been the traditional, cultural and financially sound decision
- Jesus' philosophy of family

Matthew 12:48-50 - *"Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?" 49 Pointing to his disciples, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. 50 For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother."*

Matthew 19:29 - *"And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or fields for my sake will receive a hundred times as much and will inherit eternal life."*

The relationship Jesus most cares about is His relationship with you

Relationships matter to Jesus

- Around 50 “one another’ passages in the New Testament
 - More than close friend, but devoted family
- We should meet the needs of the family of God even when it’s an inconvenience
- Jesus sets the example for meeting the needs of others... it’s up to us to follow His work
