The Message: INSPIRED (#5)

Jesus' last words:

1. **Father forgive them.** (Lk 23:34)
2. **Today you will be with me in paradise.** (Lk 23:43)
3. **Woman, behold your son, son behold your mother.** (Jn 19:26)
4. **My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?** (Mt 27:46)
5. **I thirst.** (Jn 19:28)
6. **It is finished.** (Jn 19:30)
7. **Into your hands I commit my spirit.** (Lk 23:46)

TODAY'S MESSAGE: "Father, I entrust my spirit into your hands." Luke 23:46 (NLT)

Joshua said last week: "Christianity is all about the VERY WORST happening to the very best...Jesus." So, if Jesus didn't abandon you during HIS very worst (on the cross), He will not abandon you during YOUR worst.

BIG IDEA: Fix your eyes on the FINISHER!

Luke 23:44-56 (NLT)

By this time it was about noon, and darkness fell across the whole land until three o'clock. 45The light from the sun was gone. And suddenly, the curtain in the sanctuary of the Temple was torn down the middle. 46Then Jesus shouted, "Father, I entrust my spirit into your hands!" And with those words he breathed his last.

47When the Roman officer overseeing the execution saw what had happened, he worshiped God and said, "Surely this man was innocent." 48And when all the crowd that came to see the crucifixion saw what had happened, they went home in deep sorrow. 49But Jesus' friends, including the women who had followed him from Galilee, stood at a distance watching. 50Now there was a good and righteous man named Joseph. He was a member of the Jewish high council, 51but he had not agreed with the decision and actions of the other religious leaders. He was from the town of Arimathea in Judea, and he was waiting for the Kingdom of God to come. 52He went to Pilate and asked for Jesus' body. 53Then he took the body down from the cross and wrapped it in a long sheet of linen cloth and laid it in a new tomb that had been carved out of rock. 54This was done late on Friday afternoon, the day of preparation, as the Sabbath was about to begin.

55As his body was taken away, the women from Galilee followed and saw the tomb where his body was placed. 56Then they went home and prepared spices and ointments to anoint his

body. But by the time they were finished the Sabbath had begun, so they rested as required by the law.

“And with those words He breathed His last.” (v46b)

Pause for a few seconds and quietly thank Jesus for what He suffered through for our forgiveness.

He breathed His last.

When was the last time you meditated on that?

Jesus’s last words on the cross were an expression of trust, of letting go, and of ultimate submission. He could have controlled it. But He chose to trust His Father in Heaven with the control.

The way Jesus behaved on the cross must have made quite an impression on the Roman guards. Luke records that one of the guards said something right after Jesus breathed His last. It is recorded in **Luke 23:47 (NLT)**

“When the Roman officer overseeing the execution saw what had happened, he worshiped God and said, “Surely this man was innocent.”

I am wondering if you and I can trust like Jesus did

“Father...I entrust my spirit into your hands.”

HEBREWS 11:1 (NIV)

Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.

It’s crazy what we trust (Full Faith) in.

- Red light
- Yellow Dotted line as you drive
- Parachute or Hot Air Balloon
- Pilots and airplanes
- Construction workers...bridges, tunnels, buildings
- Architects
- Nutritional facts on a soda can
- What we read or see on Instagram
- Physicians, scalpel, organ replacement

YOU ARE A PROVEN TRUSTING PERSON . . . Can you trust God enough to...

- Forgive?
- Tithe?
- Help a stranger?
- Let go of controlling your spouse?
- Commit to church attendance every weekend?
- Apologize for harm we caused?
- Not judge others?
- Resist temptation and peer pressure?
- Not manipulate the situation?
- Not abuse or manipulate our power of position?
- Not belittle others to boost our own self-esteem?
- Let go and let God?

CONTROL -- Personal Behavior, Not Outcomes. Can you control . . .

- How your teenager will turn out?
- How big your church is going to get?
- How your spouse treats you?
- Whether or not your boss gives you a pay raise?
- Whether or not your son plays in the NFL, NBA, or MLB?
- Your neighbor?
- Whether or not a person gives up a bad habit or an addiction?

WHAT YOU CANNOT CONTROL (Outcomes):

- That life will turn out the way we would like
- Other people, places and things
- What is happening in the world

WHAT YOU CAN CONTROL (Behavior):

- Attitude
- Behavior
- Values
- Needs
- Desires
- What I DO in response to what happens

THE BIG IDEA

I will control what I think, say, and do . . . **and entrust all outcomes to Jesus.**

“Trust in the Lord with all your heart, do not depend on your own understanding. Seek His will in all you do, and He will show you which path to take.” Proverbs 3:5-6 (NLT)
